This has been another milestone year for Synchro Swim New Zealand.

A long anticipated goal of having our National Team participate in a competition outside New Zealand was achieved. The National Team, under coaches Kazuko Tapper and Audra Arbas, competed at the Japan Open in May 2009. This is the first time Synchro Swim New Zealand has had a TEAM swim at an International competition for approximately 18 years. While we have competed at the Oceania Championships with Free Combination Teams, it is most pleasing to be in a position to have a Team ready and able to compete in Technical and Free Routines.

Our thanks go to the Southern Trust for the funds granted towards costs of the training camps which were held for the National Training Squad, in preparation for Team selection and competition preparation. These were held in January and April in Wellington, following National Training Squad selection in Christchurch in October. A further camp was held in Auckland immediately prior to departure for the Japan Open Championships.

Our congratulations to the coaches and the Team members for a creditable performance in Japan, and we look forward to achieving further goals for the National Team, most significantly, competing with distinction at the World Championships in 2013.

The second major milestone was holding the Inaugural National Open Championships in March in Wellington. While the entry numbers were small, the competition will grow, as athletes and coaches prepare for competing in competitions outside New Zealand. Our thanks to the Wellington Synchro Club for the assistance to the SSNZ Board in running this competition.

The 2008 National Championships were held in Christchurch at the beginning of October with, once again, increased entry numbers. Our thanks go to Jane and Iain Percy, Kylie McEwen and their Canterbury Synchronised Swimming Club Committee for an excellent job.

At the time of writing entry numbers for the 2009 National Championships are again increased.

The SPARC funding we received for Sport Development this year has enabled us to continue in the development area, most particularly with Professional Development and support for the National Training Squad. I would like to acknowledge the support of our Relationship Manager at SPARC, Sarah Anderson

We were fortunate to be granted a FINA Development Clinic for 2009. This was held in Auckland in July, with the presenter Jennifer Gray from Great Britain. Our thanks are expressed to the New Zealand Community Trust for the funding assistance towards the costs of holding this Clinic. It was targeted at new and intermediate coaches and judges, and was invaluable for the knowledge gained, interaction between coaches judges and athletes, and increased communication and co-operation between the clubs.

I would like to thank Bronwyn Stackpole for all the work involved in organising this Clinic.

SSNZ Board communication continues to be principally by telephone and e-mail, and one full Board meeting was held in August. A large amount was achieved at this meeting, including a full review of our Strategic Plan, reviews of all our selection Policies and Criteria, planning for the National Training Squad and creation of Policies Protocols and Procedures for National Teams.

Financial

As well as the funding from SPARC, and the funding assistance from the Southern Trust and the New Zealand Community Trust, we received NZ Post Community Post envelopes, an initiative which sees charitable and sports bodies receive this administrative assistance.

As is normal, the SSNZ Annual Accounts will be tabled at the AGM for members' audit. Our financial position remains sound, and is consistent with the financial performance last year.

Administration

Once again, I am very grateful to everyone who has assisted with the administrative tasks for our sport. We continue to investigate the possibility of having a National Administrator, but the current economic climate has made this increasingly difficult to obtain the necessary outside funding assistance.

I would like to particularly thank Bronwyn Stackpole for the secretarial work, Debbie Poutoa for the continued management of our National Membership data base, and administration of the Affiliation Fees payments, Jenny Carroll for managing the Star Awards distribution and finances, and Michelle Anderson, Bronwyn Stackpole and Nola Younger for their roles with the management of the National Training Squad and National Team.

Our thanks to Ita Daniels and Kit Hustler for their work on the Computer Scoring Programme specific for our New Zealand Competitions



JAPAN OPEN NATIONALS

Tokyo, Japan - May 1-5, 2009 By Audra Arbas

As the first high level international competition for the selected New Zealand 2009 National Team members, Japan Opens proved to be both challenging and rewarding. The overall range of competition at Japan Opens was a comfortable height for the athlete's first experience. There was enough of a high range that they could learn and be inspired, but also enough of a low range that they didn't feel completely "alone" in their abilities. The lowest score of the competition was a 56.167 received by the Chinese Taipei Free Team. The highest was 95.000, which was earned by the Japanese National Free Team during Finals. New Zealand's scoring and placements were as follows:

The primary goal of the competition was to expose our athletes to a well run, high level, international competition, with good judging, good competition, and a welcoming first step. The athletes trained with hopes of achieving 7's at the competition. The score ranges received were as follows:

Tech Solo:	7.0 - 7.9	Free Solo:	7.1 - 7.9
Tech Duet:	6.8 - 7.4	Free Duet:	6.9 - 7.3

The NZ coaches were overall pleased with the outcome of the scores/placements. The athletes adapted well to the pressure and stress that comes with this level of competition. They were exposed to strict foreign coaches, older and more experienced athletes, media, professionalism, long hours, high expectations, strict schedules, and an entirely new view on what it means to be a team.

The most positive lessons that the athletes absorbed were in the days leading up to competing. They swam in heavily crowded pools amongst intimidating athletes and managed to push through the water as if to say "We belong right here beside you!" That is a hard feat for a young team in "new waters". They learned the importance of representing not only their team, but their country. They absorbed new training tactics, mentality, respect, and motivation from the athletes around them, and of course found themselves saying "Oh! Now I understand". These are invaluable lessons understood only through personal exposure to competitions of this level. Coaches can train, teach, and say as much as they like, but until athletes experiences things for themselves, they can't fully comprehend.

Following competition, the coaches approached judges, coaches, and officials from Japan, Malaysia, and Canada to get feedback on the New Zealand performances. The general feedback was joy to have NZ representing with a full team. More so, a young, well built team with great future potential. With our youngest athletes only 13 years old, competing against competitors up to 26, they have the ability to be amongst the elite in the world during their synchro career. More than one foreign official commented on the beautiful physique of our athletes (i.e. long limbs!), which is a great advantage to athletes in synchro. More detailed feedback on choreography, routine specific corrections, and advice on how to improve was discussed and immediately shared with the athletes.

In the end, the 2009 National Team members represented their country with pride and determination. They entered the competition with little comprehension of what to expect and left with a mind full of new knowledge to bring home. They have made a positive first step in their work toward becoming an international strength. Their greatest success being the motivation to take what they have learned, put it into action, and compete again amongst the world's best in 2010.
