

Warm-Up Lanes

There will be 3 warm-up lanes in the 25-metre pool (Marshalling end) for competitors to warm up during the competition.

Gelling Area

There is no facility at the pool to accommodate gelling. It is advised that gelling is undertaken before you arrive at the pool.

There will be a small table outside the toilets, to the right of the entrance, which will be available but only recommended for touch-ups.

Stretching

With limited space at the pool, stretching can be conducted in the space behind the spectators' stands that runs the length of the pool. Alternatively, there is plenty of outdoor space that can be accessed via the doors by the baby pool if the weather is warm.

Entry to the Pool

The entrance for athletes, judges, and officials is around the back of the complex. If you follow the road round on the right-hand side of the complex you will find the entrance which takes you directly to the dive pool.

Spectators should enter the complex through the public entrance.

Café

An on-site cafe is at the swimming complex which provides refreshments and lunch options.

Car Parking

Waterworld has two car parks, both of which are accessed from Garnett Avenue. The main car park is in front of the complex and the second, a smaller car park, is opposite the complex. There is also off-road parking available on the street around Waterworld. **Please do not park at the rear of the complex as this is strictly reserved for staff only**.

Pool Photography and Video Policy: Waterworld does not have a formal video policy. Please only take photos/video recordings of swimmers within your club.

Please enter key personnel information (Name and contact details of Team Manager/s, and Coaches) to ensure we can communicate effectively to the right people. Please note communication at the competition will be predominantly through WhatsApp.

Schools Competition - Registration Requirements

The Intermediate (Years 7-8) and Secondary School (Years 9-10) (Years 11-13) competitions will not be run separately- rather routine scores will be taken from their entries in other areas. Duets and Teams can be formed with another school on the agreement of both schools.

- Music Practice Teams will need to arrive in Hamilton as early as possible on Saturday morning to
 enable everyone to have their music practice. Tauranga will be scheduled first as the host club with the Auckland Clubs scheduled immediately after. Other Clubs will be scheduled depending on
 arrival
- Music Practice time will be based on one swim-through only of each routine.



- **Scoring announcements** The preliminary score will be read out following the routine and once scores are in. Please note the score readout will not be the final score, as it will not include Figures' scores or any penalties that may be applied.
- **Prizegiving** will be held at the pool daily assuming everything runs smoothly with the Scoring System. Some flexibility may be needed!
- **Flights out -** Teams should arrange to fly out as late as possible on the 1 October to ensure they are here for prizegiving.
- Trials Any athletes who are trialing for Squads should schedule their return flights after 5 pm to allow time for trials to finish. Suggest these could be flexi time in case we finish early. Clubs will be responsible for any trial athletes, judges, and coaches' accommodation on the night before trials. Remember, all Clubs trialing will be required to bring a minimum of 1 judge, and if you have more than 6 triallists two judges, and if more than 12 triallists three judges.

Competition Rules

NZ Nationals will be conducted under the rules of World Aquatics and Artistic Swimming NZ. World Aquatics Rules

2024 ASNZ Competition Rules

- Please note there will be new Quad rules announced following Junior Worlds in August. <u>Any changes introduced then WILL NOT be applied to NZ competitions until 2025</u>
- The same rules will apply that we ran North and South Islands in i.e. including the new Apnea and Factors as per the World Aquatics Memo of March 1st, and the AQUA Difficulty Guide - v4.2 March 5, 2024 (R-T Limit L5-9 ALL events)-2.pdf
- Factoring for Dolphins will apply based on the Youth Combination Factoring

Figures Draw

Figures Draws will be emailed to Coaches and Judges 72 hours before the competition **as** per the World Aquatics requirements

This will be at noon on Wednesday 25 September.

The Meet Referee will make the draw. This will be emailed and sent out by Yvonne to all Team Managers and will be posted on the ASNZ Facebook page.

Entry Fees

Entry fees apply to all swimmers, including any reserves named for Solo, Duet, Team, and Combination / Acrobatic events.

• Event fee: \$145 per competitor. This includes photos and tech support.

• **Figures:** \$25 per entry

(if an athlete enters figures in two age groups they will need to pay twice)

• **Routines:** \$35 per swimmer per event (solo, duet, teams, combo, acrobatics)

• **Schools:** \$10 entry

Entry invoices will be sent to Clubs by mid-August. Payment is to be made by 09 September.

- **Each NZ Club** entering swimmers at the National Championships must send one Judge/Technical Controller for every 6 swimmers entered in the competition. We expect within the 1:6 ratio at least
 - One experienced judge (who has been judging at least 2 Nationals Events) within the club quota.
 - One experienced Technical Controller who has been the TC at least one event and has completed the NZ TC training. For example: If you have 7 swimmers, you would be required to provide 2 judges and so on - note we are not rounding down!
- If you don't have a Technical Controller/ or enough Judges in your Club, please contact Sue Van Os at judging@artisticswimmingnz.org.nz and she will connect you with Judges and TC from the Te Pangu Club. The cost of flights and accommodation for Judges/ TCs will need to be paid for by the Club.
 - If you have more Judges than your ratio who wish to come, please include their names too, as other Clubs who don't have enough Judges may choose to fund them to meet their club judging ratio commitment.
- Judges must be fully committed to judging at the event, including all Judge Education
 Forums and feedback sessions. Note: A Club can provide two judges if they wish to share their
 allocations across the event (but this will be counted for 1 judge in total for the Club's judge
 commitment) and must be approved by ASNZ before registering your judges. Both Judges
 must also be available for all Judge Education/Forums and debriefs.
- Coaches cannot judge unless prior approval has been granted by ASNZ. Approval will be made on a case-by-case basis and at the full discretion of ASNZ. However, coaches may be included in Figures judging panels if they are not judging their club athletes. Judges must be 18 years of age at the commencement of the competition.



- Athletes who are swimming in two or fewer events can be counted as a half judge in the 1-6 ratio. Athletes who are swimming in more than two events can shadow judge.
- International teams would be required to bring Judges and technical controllers based on the New Zealand Club ratio of 1:6. If you would prefer to use a NZ judge to meet this commitment, please contact Sue and she would be happy to connect you to someone though there is likely to be a cost involved to get them to Hamilton e.g. flights and accommodation (but this will still be much cheaper than flying them from overseas!).

Judging and TC Pre-Competition Training

Judges will be expected to attend pre-competition online sessions. Dates will be confirmed ASAP

Technical Controllers

All TCs are expected to join 2 x 1 hs online sessions in the lead-up to Nationals. Dates will be confirmed ASAP.





We need as many volunteers as possible to make sure this event runs effectively. Volunteers will be put in areas for a block period, i.e. Morning Blocks/Afternoon Blocks and Later Afternoon.

To help share the load across all participating clubs we have assigned clubs focus areas to oversee, this also assists with training and quick handover during the event. We ask clubs to please register volunteers using **THIS FORM** by **1 September**.

We plan to have the volunteer roster out to everyone the week before Nationals.

Volunteer Roles: There are a variety of roles in the competition that we require people to support. It is a great way to meet Synchro members and you also to get a front-row seat. Roles include:

Figures Competition

- Marshalls We require many marshalls to assist with taking athletes around and making sure they are in competition order. - 4 Marshalls
- **Callers** 4 Callers reading out the figures scores
- **Scorers** Scorers for figures recording scores on the computer system and paper- we need 8 people
- **Videographers** filming figures using an iPad(we need 4 people)

- **Marshalling** Athletes- This role is to tick off athletes for upcoming events and make sure swimmers are in programme order. (2 People)
- Timekeeping Timing of routines (You will be poolside) we need 3 timekeepers for each event
- Music we need 2- 3 people to support during the competition
- **Announcer** we need 2 people to support during each day
- **Videographers** filming routines (we need 3 people TC Table/ Synchronisation Table, and Routine)

Below is important information and a timeline of requirements.

Coach Cards

- Coaches MUST USE the ISS system to complete their Coach Cards. Please do not edit in Excel
- This system will do all of the calculations for you and is quite simple to set up.
- Coaches will need to use a WINDOWS operating system to download and run the ISS coaching card programme - Windows 10 or 11 is the norm.
- Please when you are completing the Coach Card EACH TIME go into the ISS website and download the latest coaching card software. The software is updated all the time. If you send us a coach card that has been created on an old version, it may not work.

We will set up a Club Google Folder for each club to drop in their Coach Cards. Yvonne will be sending each club folder in August

- Coach Cards for all routines MUST be submitted by <u>12 September</u> there will be no changes after this date.
- Late Coaching Cards Clubs will be charged an automatic \$50 penalty if this deadline is missed.
 Entering all the data into the system takes many volunteer hours. The volunteers have set aside time to work on this based on the set dates.
- If coaching cards have not been set up correctly and the Chief Scorer is required to go back to clubs more than 2 times a \$50 penalty charge will be applied to clubs. Please ensure coaching cards are checked and all information is entered.
- Coach Card Request Change Due to Medical Need A request in writing can be made to the Meet Referee (Kira van Os) and Lead Technical Controller (Luciana Garcia) up to 24 hours before the athlete's event. The request for a change to the Coach Card must be accompanied by a medical certificate for the person who is sick/injured and cannot perform the programme set with the Coach Card. The Meet Referee and Lead Technical Controller will consider the request for a change to the card and will get back to the coach within 12 hours of the swimmers/team event, and will work with the coach on the process to update the Coach Card if approved.



Music

REMINDER: please check the new rules - CLICK HERE

Music Allowance for all routines

- 5 seconds less or plus the allotted time of the routine
- Walk-ons for all routines
- 20 seconds for SOLOS and Duets events
- 30 seconds for Technical or Free Mixed Duets, Technical and Free Teams, Free Combination, and Acrobatic Routines

All music will be required to be sent in by 1 September.

It is highly recommended that you do not wait until the last minute to send this through in case any issues are encountered. Again, an automatic \$50 fine will be payable if this deadline is missed.

Music Format is to be MP3

Each piece of music is to be named as follows:

Club- Age Group- Event- Athletes Name (first initial and surname)
